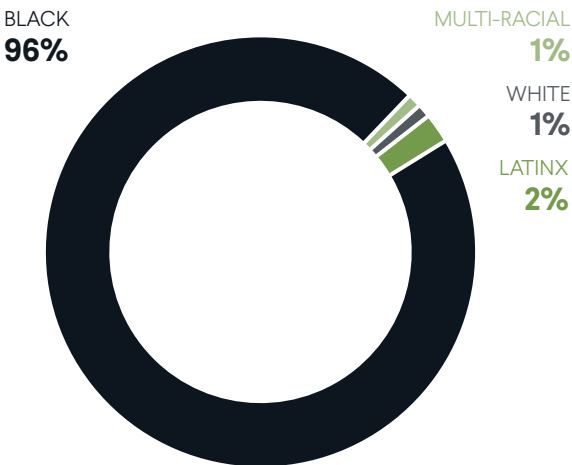

- According to the Spring 2021 ELA Ohio States Tests seventh grade scholars made more progress than expected, moderate evidence. Additionally, eighth grade scholars made more progress than expected, significant evidence. This component measures Ohio College Preparatory School scholars progress as compared to the statewide expectation of growth.
- According to the Improving At-Risk K-3 Readers component on the Ohio State Report Card Overview, 79.1% of kindergarten scholars were on-track.
