To prepare students for a college preparatory high school that will ensure success and graduation from a four year college.








## **ACADEMIC PROGRESS**


Through a well-rounded curriculum that engages students, instructional hours above state requirements, and targeted interventions, Ohio College Preparatory School increased the pace of academic recovery since the pandemic. The school exceeded state expectations for student academic growth (4 Stars, Progress) and increased its Performance Index (PI) score by over 16%.

Additionally, according to i-Ready results, 41% of students met the average growth level in Math for their grade level, with 83% growth being the average. Middle school students in Grade 6-8 performed exceptionally well with over 100% progress made in Grades 6-7 and over 200% progress made in Grade 8. Similarly, 44% of students met the average growth level in Reading for their grade level, with 82% growth being the average. Students in Grades 6 and 8 achieved over 100% progress.

#### PROGRESS COMPONENT RATINGS BY SUBJECT & GRADE LEVEL


